CEO Report	<ul> <li>Cindy Levi reviewed the following in her report:         <ul> <li>The last day of 2021 Georgia State Legislative Session was March 31. The bills that effect Avita include allowing APRNs to prescribe schedule II drugs in emergencies, authorization for health care providers to provide telehealth services from home, meetings and public hearing can be via teleconference in non-emergency situations, and LMFTs can facilitate 1013s</li> <li>An Appendix K extension was approved by CMS. Avita will receive a 10% increase for NOW and COMP waiver rates. They are effective March 1, 2021. A 5% increase in these rates were approved by the state on a permanent basis and await CMS approval.</li> <li>All active WellCare clients will roll over to the Peach State Medicaid plan effective May 1</li> <li>Avita staff have returned to work in-person and clients will be back to in-person beginning in May</li> <li>DBHDD will discontinue 1/12<sup>th</sup> payments for OP services effective June 30, 2021. We will then return to fee for service payments</li> <li>We will be receiving \$116,067 as our portion of the COVID-19 business interruption insurance claim</li> <li>We have received the certificate of occupancy for the BHCC and hope to have an open house before the end of May, and the CSU moved to the new facility in early June</li> <li>SAMHSA released a grant opportunity for which we will apply. If awarded, Avita plans to use the funds for expansion of the Forsyth County Co-Responder Program, expansion of telehealth, and training of staff in trauma-informed care</li> <li>MTM Services will be providing online trainings in preparation for Georgia's transition to a CCBHC model of BH service delivery</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
