



Hart County Board of Commissioners
Called Meeting Tuesday March 29, 2022, at 6:00 PM
At the Administrative and Emergency Services
Building

The Meeting was called to order by Chairman Sayer. Commissioners in attendance were Commissioner Dorsey, Commissioner Teasley, and Commissioner Bennett.

The agenda was amended to add approval for County participation in the National Opioid class action lawsuit and an executive Session for Personnel and Litigation. Commissioner Teasley made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Bennett provided a second to the motion. The motion passed by a 3-0 vote

1. County's participation in Opioid class action lawsuit.

County Attorney Gordon briefed the Board of specifics of the lawsuit to the commissioners as to the need for the County to join and take part in the action. Chairman Sayer made a motion to approve contingent on the County Attorney consulting with Sheriff Cleveland for any objections or recommendations. Commissioner Teasley provided a second to the motion. The motion passed by a 4-0 vote.

2. Subdivision Ordinance Discussion

Chairman Sayer opened discussion to clarify some misconceptions that he has heard about what the moratorium does and doesn't mean. There is nothing involved with this action that prevents a property owner from cutting an acre out of their property for conservation purposes, or to build or keep their present house if they sell the remaining property, cutting a part of their property out to sell, etc. This concerns the division of land for development of subdivisions that have multiple lots for development. Other discussions were on diverse ways of controlling the growth were continued. No official actions were taken.

3. Executive Session – Personnel - Litigation

A motion was made by Commissioner Dorsey was made to enter into executive session for Personnel and Litigation. A second to the motion was provided by Commissioner Teasley. The motion passed by a 4-0 vote.

A motion was made by Commissioner Dorsey to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Teasley provided a second to the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0
