

Runoff Facts

1. Eligible voters are those who registered before November 7, 2022 deadline.
2. If you are an eligible voter and did not vote in the Nov. 8 General Election, you ARE eligible to vote in the runoff.
3. If you voted in the General Election and submitted a change of address, name change, or any other type of change after November 7, it will NOT be processed before the runoff election.
4. Absentee by mail voters who met the requirements and chose to “Opt-in to receive an absentee ballot for the rest of the election cycle,” will automatically receive an absentee ballot for the runoff.
5. Voters that are not eligible to “opt-in”, or did not mark the choice to opt-in, will need to re-apply for an absentee ballot. Only those 65 and older, or disabled, are eligible for this option.
6. The last day to request an absentee ballot is Nov. 28.
7. You may check your voter registration and absentee ballot status or request an absentee ballot at **sos.ga.gov**. Go to the **Elections Tab** and choose the **My Voter Page** link.

Other Election News and Dates:

A risk limiting audit for the November 8, 2022 General Election will take place Thursday, November 17, 2022 at 9am. The race that will be audited is the Secretary of State. There will be a hand count of random batches to compare to the scanner results. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.
