Hart County Board of Commissioners met September 24, 2024, at 6:00 at the Hart County Administrative & Emergency Services Center.

Chairman Marshall Sayer presided with Commissioners Michael Bennett, Frankie Teasley, and Joey Dorsey in attendance with Commissioner Jeff Brown attending the meeting via Microsoft Teams.

1. Prayer

Commissioner Bennett opened the meeting with prayer.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

Everyone stood in observance of the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Call to Order

Chairman Sayer called the meeting to order.

4. Welcome

Chairman Sayer welcomed those in attendance either in person, via Hart County Board of Commissioners YouTube site or HTC Channel 3. He also welcomed Commissioner Brown via Microsoft Teams.

5. Approve Agenda

County Administrator Terrell Partain asked to have item 12 D Liberty Church Rd/Liberty Hill Rd Intersection added to the agenda.
Commissioner Teasley moved to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Bennett provided a second. The motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Bennett moved to approve the minutes. Commissioner Teasley provided a second. The motion carried 5-0.

9. County Administrator's Report

County Administrator/EMA Director Terrell Partain EMA Director gave information on tropical storm headed this way on Thursday and Friday. He wanted to make everyone aware that the storm is predicted to be at least a Category 1 possibly a Category 4 hurricane. It will be similar to the hurricane that came through our way in 2017. He advised that everyone should take proper precautions.

10. Chairman's Report

Chairman Sayer commented on social media post about comparing the sales tax of Hart County to surrounding counties. He remarked that if you are going to compare taxes you should include property taxes also. He also gave the millage rates of surrounding counties noting that Hart County had the lowest. Chairman Sayer pointed out that the County Administration and Department Heads and everyone involved in County business are good stewards of the County's funds.

11. Commissioner's Report

Commissioner Bennett thanked all the County Departments. He remarked that the school's millage rate is also lower than surrounding counties. He commented all County employees are doing a good job with utilizing the County's funds.

Commissioner Teasley commented on trees at the Nancy Drive side of Ridge Road that people are having trouble seeing to pull out.

Commissioner Brown explained that he is on Microsoft Teams due to him having emergency eye surgery and is experiencing a lot of discomfort.

Commissioner Dorsey offered get will wishes to Commissioner Brown: echoed County Administrator Terrell Partain's sentiments for citizens to prepare for the upcoming storm; stated the true way to look at the millage rate is the cost to provide services per citizen, using different revenue sources and that Hart County's millage rate is still lower than surrounding counties.

Commissioner Dorsey moved to accept the 2nd reading to amend ordinance section 66-206 Exhibit A. Commissioner Teasley provided a second to the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

Commissioner Dorsey sent an email to all the Commissioners, County Administrator Terrell Partain and County Attorney Kim Higginbotham for review. Several subdivisions including Early Drive are being developed on county roads with little to no right of way. Commissioner Dorsey moved to direct County Attorney Kim Higginbotham draft an amendment to the subdivision ordinance stating that a 60 foot right of way should be deeded to the County on level II subdivisions; he added that no subdivisions would be approved until this amendment is in place. Commissioner Teasley provided a second to the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

- d) Liberty Church Road/Liberty Hill Road Intersection Discussion

Mr. Craft thanked the Commissioners for their service and the opportunity to speak. He stated that he had seen accident and knows of many others that had happened at this intersection. He provided pictures and a sketch of the intersection. Mr. Craft proposed that a 4-way stop be installed. Commissioner Bennett moved that County Administrator Terrell Partain reach out to GA DOT to do a traffic study on the intersection at Liberty Church Road and Liberty Hill Road. Commissioner Teasley provided a second to the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

Liberty Church road runs from Hwy 172 into Elbert County. It is approximately 2.5 miles and is in District 5. This will be the 3rd and final reading.

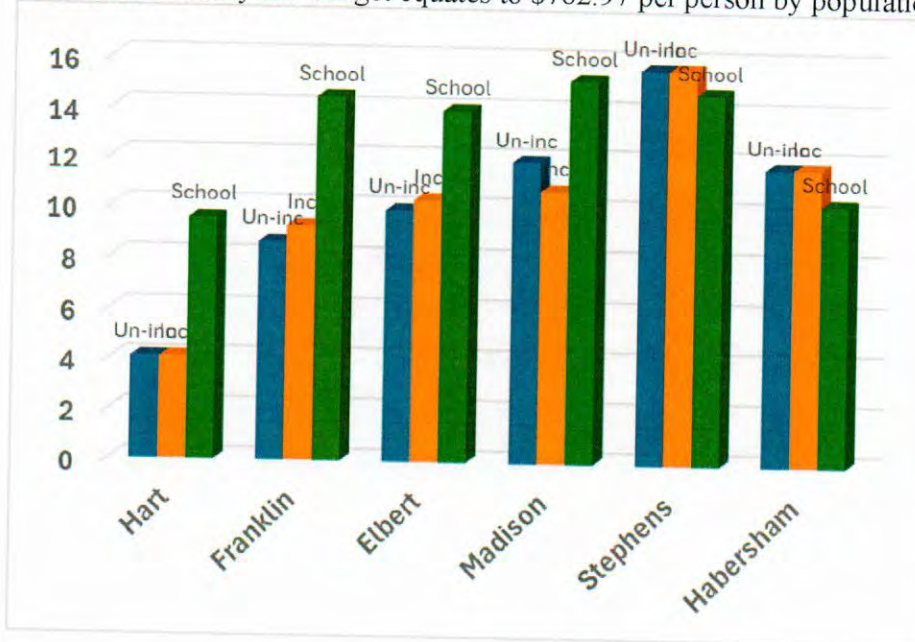

SALES TAX AND INSURANCE PREMIUM TAX ROLLBACK RESOLUTION

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Hart County, in compliance with existing laws pertaining to the funding of services or reduction in taxation of properties in unincorporated Hart County, Georgia as the result of receipt of funds from **INSURANCE PREMIUM TAX** it is hereby resolved that there shall be an "Insurance Premium Rollback" in the amount of **0.0 mills** which shall apply only against the Maintenance and Operations levy for the unincorporated areas of Hart County, Georgia. Utilization of proceeds from this fund shall also be used for the funding of Services in Unincorporated Hart County

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Hart County, that in order to provide a reduction in taxation of properties in Hart County, Georgia as the result of the receipt of funds from the **LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX**, it is hereby resolved that there shall be a "Property Tax Rollback" in the amount of **2.228 mills** which shall apply against the maintenance and operations levy for all areas of Hart County, Georgia.

RE: Item 13 A DFACS Board Appointments

We have had 3 opening on the DFACS Board for some time. We have received 3 Applicants that qualify.

These are the requirements required under State Code:

per O.C.G.A.49-3-2 (amended via SB 138) the governing authority (Local County Board of Commissioners) shall ensure that all appointments made on or after July 1,2015, are made from the following categories:

- (1) Pediatric health care providers;
- (2) Appropriate school personnel;
- (3) Emergency responders;
- (4) Law enforcement personnel;
- (5) Private child welfare service providers;
- (6) Alumni of the child welfare system;
- (7) Mental health care providers;
